Overview


- We are faithful in our tithe to UFMCC
- We are current on our Pension Fund with UFMCC
- 2023 Annual Budget of \$387,000 approved at Congregational Meeting
- For King of Peace by the numbers, we surveyed 168 active members, and received 79 responses or 47%
 - 70% have been associated with King of Peace for more than 15 years
 - 73% attend service weekly and 24% attend regularly
 - We average about 90 In-Person and 24 Facebook Live attendees and another 215 On-line views of services




King of Peace

By-the-Numbers


Relationship Status




Age Range




Sexual Identity





A Brief History

Founded in 1975 as a mission of Tampa MCC, King of Peace MCC has been on the move ever since. We have had sanctuary in living rooms, a store front, our own 'Little Yellow House', a former Funeral Home, a former Eagles Club, a former Cinema, and shared church spaces. In each, we spread the word and shared fellowship. Funded through garage sales and donations, the congregation pitched in with imagination and perspiration to transform each of these "former" spaces into our Church Alive.



The spaces were alive with Sunday Worship – sometimes twice! Thursday Dinners and monthly Saturday Theme Parties, Groups for Singles, Women, Therapy, Happy Cookers, Choir, Trans, AIDS, Ubuntu, Gay Parents and an active Bookstore.

We brought in the Miami Gay Men's Choir, and, out of that concert, the well-loved Gay Men's Chorus of Tampa Bay was established. We set a mission in New Port Richey with Spirit of Life MCC, in the Dominican Republic for an orphanage & school and a new MCC Church in Cuba: SOMOS ICM.


From SDIA (turning AIDS around), an outreach with counseling, dinners, a buddy program and two homes operating to accept patients released from hospital care, was born what has grown into Metro Inclusive Health – now identified as the 2nd largest LGBTQ+ focused health and community center in the US.



King Of Peace

A Brief History

We continued, pressing forward with a focus on leadership, spiritual & personal development and caring. Creating our H.O.T. (Human Outreach Team) ministry for the distribution of food and support to the unhoused. Fundraising events raising over 100 thousand dollars to support various community programs over the years. Transgender Community events to honor and remember as well as name alignment baptisms. Congregational Enrichment classes in bible studies, finance, health, movies, legal issues, Servant Leadership and Creating a Life that Matters.



Our Higher Tech multimedia team - already leveraging Facebook Live with multiple cameras, and effective use of lighting and online giving - was well positioned to transition to the constraints of COVID and the post-COVID landscape.

We have a long history of member and clergy involvement at the denomination level, including clergy on the Board of Elders and members on the Governing Board, Board of Pensions, Assessments, Finance Team and Conference Planning Committee.



King Of Peace

A Brief History

Embracing God's Will, we bid farewell to an Associate Pastor and a retiring Senior Pastor and welcomed our Interim Pastor. Further, while we did not understand, it was evident our church home - the former cinema - no longer served God's purpose for King of Peace and the building was sold. We were able to sell at a good profit and were honored to share the beautiful sanctuary and property of Lakewood United Methodist Church.

Our congregation prayed together weekly as we searched for the space which serves God's plan for King of Peace Church Alive of the future and we are now purchasing Good Samaritan Presbyterian Church! They are a church whose ideals align with us and who are very active in serving the community, especially with their food pantry, which makes us very excited that part of God's plan for us includes being placed in a position to share space with Good Samaritan after the sale. We look forward to how our congregations can build a relationship as neighbors to each other and Pinellas County!

Pinellas Park

Begun as sugar cane farms, situated about halfway between downtown St. Pete and downtown Clearwater with Tampa just across the bridge, Pinellas Park is the home of our new church building.

According to the King of Peace history, over the years we have been homed from Clearwater to Southern Pinellas Point. It seems fitting that our new space places us right in the middle of it all!

A blend of residential and industrial areas with hidden gems from verdant parks to vibrant art and small restaurants loved by locals. Its centrality positions us to be a viable place of worship for everyone in the area!





St. Petersburg


- 5th largest city by population in Florida, called the 'Sunshine City' of the 'Sunshine State'!
- Average daily high in the hot season is 85 and 73 in the cold season.
- With only about 5 non-sunny days a year, rain is just liquid sunshine.

Out and Proud

St Pete Pride is Florida's largest, with the last count coming in at an estimated 300,000 for our downtown waterfront event.

Consistently a top city for LGBTQ+ people, last voted at #3!

Scored 100 on the HRC Municipal Equality Index for the last 9 years.

Two LGBTQ+ Liaisons, one for the city and one for the police.

Our LGBTQ Film Festival is the longest running Film Festival in FL.

Transgender Day of Remembrance parade and city celebration.



Metro Inclusive Health, born from King of Peace SDIA ministry, is the 2nd largest LGBTQ+ focused healthcare provider in the nation.





Twenty-five miles of soft white sand - 3 of our **beaches** have been named the most beautiful in the US!

Three protected **Wetlands** to explore: Sawgrass Lake Park, Cliff Stephens Park & Canal Park, and Lake Tarpon Outfall Canal.

Ft De Soto Park is 1,100 acres of outdoor activity from fishing, boat ramps, nature trails, and kayak rentals to dog parks, camping, ball fields, and a historic Spanish American War Fort to explore.

Egmont Key State Park wildlife refuge accessible only by boat. A natural and cultural history on the edge of the Gulf of Mexico with connections in history to the Seminole War, Civil War and Spanish-American war including an 1858 lighthouse.





Sunken Gardens Over 100 years old, St Pete's oldest living museum, with 4 acres of Botanical Gardens waterfalls, a flock of flamingos and more than 50K plants and flowers.

St Pete Pier re-envisioned and re-opened in 2020 with 26 acres of swimming, fishing, picnic areas, restaurants, a museum, parks, playgrounds, live entertainment and outdoor concert spaces. Plus, all the shopping and restaurants on Beach Drive!

Sports: baseball - The Rays and Yankees (spring training), soccer - Rowdies, football - Buccaneers and hockey - The Lightning.

LGBTQ+ Sports Groups: Frontrunners, Pride Bowling, Suncoast Softball, Advantage Tampa Bay Tennis, Rainbow Sports League, Kickball
